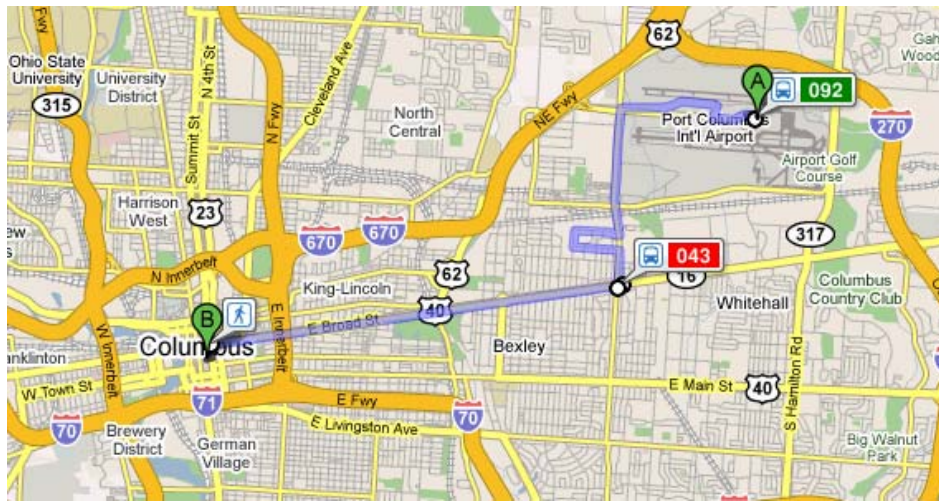

Driving from Port Columbus International Airport (8 miles): Take I-670 West toward downtown to 3rd St. exit. Follow 3rd St. approximately 7 traffic lights to State St. Hotel is on right at 3rd St. and State St. The Hyatt's valet parking is on the right.

Public transportation from Port Columbus International Airport: Walk to Port Columbus Terminal Loop & Int G; Ride Bus 92 – Direction 92 James Road to Eastland; Exit S. James Rd. & E. Broad St.; Walk to E. Broad St. & N. James Rd.; Transfer to Bus 43 - Direction 43 East Broad Express; Exit E. Broad St. and N. 3rd St; Walk south on 3rd Street, turn right on E. State. St.; Arrive at 75 East State Street (travel time: approximately one hour).
