Letter from the Executive Director, Are we seeing a climate change "thaw"?

It might seem ironic to be talking about a thaw right now given that spring snow storms are pummelling the northeast. However, there are many signs that show North America is emerging from the climate silence that took hold follow ing the economy's dip into recession and the politicization of the issue in US Congress. These promising signs include:

- US President Obama dedicating a significant portion of his most recent State of the Union speech to climate change, emphasizing, "If Congress w on't act soon to protect future generations, I w ill."
- A number of states and provinces continuing to move forward with carbon pricing mechanisms, including the northeast states involved in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI), California, Quebec, British Columbia and Alberta.
- Hundreds of Registry members continuing to measure, report and reduce their GHG emissions using our program, demonstrating their commitment to leading sustainably.
- A large majority of Americans (88%) saying the US should make an effort to reduce global warming, even if it has economic costs.
- Nearly a quarter also saying that, in the past 12 months, they have punished companies for opposing steps to reduce global warming by not purchasing their products (Yale Project on Climate Change Communication).

We don't have to look very far for the reasons for the thaw. 2012 was the hottest year on record in the US. We saw extreme weather-related losses of \$160 billion globally, \$110 billion of which was in the US alone (Munich Re). A drought across much of the US caused nearly \$20 billion in crop damage and made the Mississippi nearly impassable. Fires raged across Colorado and other western states and Superstorm Sandy

devastated communities and families.

And in March, the United Nations released a report that reminds us that climate change has the potential to disrupt human development progress. It warns that the number of people in extreme poverty could increase by up to three billion by 2050 unless environmental disasters are averted by coordinated global action.

It's getting harder and harder for even the toughest climate change skeptics to deny what is clearly happening outside our front doors. Especially when it is increasingly clear that the price of doing nothing is going to be far steeper than taking action now.

The good news is that sub-national governments and businesses of all sizes are taking meaningful climate action. We applaud the policymakers, thought leaders, and corporations--many of whom are part of The Registry's community--for stepping up and tackling this issue head on. This is no time for silence.

The Climate Registry Releases GRP 2.0

The Climate Registry has updated its <u>General Reporting Protocol</u>, which is the guidance its members use to voluntarily measure and report their greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in a consistent, comparable, credible way.

GRP 2.0 is designed to reflect the evolution of GHG reporting best practices since the last version was published in 2008. The changes provide greater value and flexibility to our Members while maintaining the integrity of The Registry's highly-regarded reporting program.
