Water agencies are the stewards of one of California's most important resources – a resource that is at risk due to climate change. Reducing the carbon footprint of California's water cycle will help us avoid the worst effects of climate change and secure a more sustainable future.

The **Water-Energy Nexus Registry** is a **voluntary state-wide greenhouse gas (GHG) reporting program**. It is an initiative of the **California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA)** and is being administered by **The Climate Registry**. The Water-Energy Nexus Registry will help us better understand the emissions associated with each process in the water management cycle. It will also help water agencies and others:

- Make more efficient use of funding
- Make decisions that drive innovation and support more resilient infrastructure
- Identify operational efficiency and GHG reduction opportunities

The **Water-Energy Nexus Registry** will be open to **all water agencies, large water users and any other interested organizations doing business in California**. Participants will measure and track the GHGs associated with their annual extraction, consumption, delivery, storage, and/or treatment of water.
